### Parent Survey

Thank you so much to everyone who completed our parent survey. We had a return of 50% representing 55% of pupils in our school. The results are attached to this letter. You will see that one area suggested for improvement is communication. We have monthly newsletters, our school website and Facebook. We are also now emailing parents information. If you have any suggestions on how we can further improve communication then please do let us know. If you have questions or queries and are unable to come into school, we are always contactable by phone or email and will endeavour to get back to you promptly.

### Transport to events and activities



We have previously subsidised the cost of transport to visits and events from our school budget, with parents making voluntary contributions on some occasions. Our Governing Body and the Committee of our PTA have asked that as this is an area that amounts to a significant amount of our expenditure that we now ask parents for contributions whenever we are using transport. After Easter, in the new financial year, whenever we go out of school, we will let parents know the full cost of the transport and also give a suggested voluntary contribution they could make. We appreciate that if you have two children in school this can become quite costly and stress that no child would be unable to attend an event for this reason. Please contact us if you are in any way concerned.

### Holidays in term time.

We are coming up to the time of year when our children will be involved in either SATs (Standardised Assessments) or in school assessments. It is really important to try and avoid taking your child out of school for holidays at any time but particularly at this time of year. May is the key month for our Year 2 children (SATs) and June is the key month for our Year 1 children (Phonics Screening). Our Key Stage 2 and Foundation Stage children will be taking part in assessments during these months, and it is difficult for them to 'catch up' if they miss time in the Summer Term.
