For the same reason, people entering the school building, such as parents, visitors and contractors will be required to wear face coverings. Staff carrying out First Aid or intimate care are recommended to use facecoveings supplied in the areas used for these tasks. Members of staff who are anxious and would feel more comfortable may wear face coverings (mask or shield) as they feel appropriate. for example when needing to be in close physical contact with a child.
