Inadvertent transmission to others.	<ul> <li>Clear instructions are provided to staff and pupils on how to put on, remove, store and dispose of face coverings. Covering;</li> <li>The need for pupils to put on and take off their face covering in the classroom prior to entering or leaving communal areas.</li> <li>Ensuring the cleaning of hands before putting the face covering on and after taking the face covering off. Hand sanitiser is provided in classrooms and pupils are supervised in its use.</li> <li>Safe storage in individual, sealable plastic bags between use.</li> <li>Arrangements to prevent the use of coverings which are inappropriate, soiled, damp or damaged etc.</li> <li>Where disposable face coverings are worn these should be put into a bin bag in a lidded non-recyclable bin after use.</li> </ul>	School to maintain a supply of sealable plastic bags.  See Guidance on arrangement for disposal of waste  World Health Organisation (WHO) - 'How to wear a fabric mask safely' video  • All staff advised to familiarise themselves on the correct way to put on and take off a facemask. • Sealable bags are available in the First Aid area for the correct disposal of facemasks. Bags need to be sealed. • Any staff using reusable face coverings need to have a sealable plastic bag or container to store the face covering between use. • Staff are responsible to ensure any face coverings

Individuals not wearing a face covering	All staff, pupils, visitors  Potential exposure to live virus resulting in contracting Coronavirus.  Inadvertent transmission to others.	Face coverings are not required by law for employees as employers already have a legal obligation to provide a safe working environment. If the school covid risk assessment determines there are areas within the school where this cannot be achieved through social distancing (such as busy corridors etc), the use of face coverings may be considered.  Parents should provide face coverings for pupils. If pupils who are required to wear a face covering forget or are unable to provide one, the school has communicated alternative arrangements to parents, such as providing a disposable or reusable face covering.  The establishment holds a stock of disposable face coverings for use by staff and pupils where needed.  Arrangements for receiving visitors should be amended to ensure they wear face coverings where appropriate.	Staff will already have access to face coverings of their choice for use in the community and these can be worn in school. If for any reason staff don't have access to a face covering, this should be provided by the school.  Some individuals are exempt from wearing face coverings. For example people who cannot put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment, or disability, or if you are speaking to or providing assistance to someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression to communicate. The same exemptions will apply in education settings, and teachers and other staff should be sensitive to those needs.
