And finally, uniform. If you have enquired about uniform recently you will be aware that we have been looking at refreshing our school uniform. Our Governors have approved our new colour and we are just waiting for the final version of the new badge, which we hope will reflect our local area. We will send information home when it is available to buy and put images of items on our school website. Order forms will be able to be downloaded or ask Mrs McCann in the school office for a copy.

The new colour is a dark jade with our new school badge. The polo shirts will be in sky blue, a colour readily available at supermarkets and stores, although they will also be available with the logo, should parents wish to buy these. Round necked sweatshirts will be available along with cardigans, as we offer currently, in the dark jade. Trousers and skirts as now, a dark colour such as grey or black, summer dresses in the pale blue check. Caps, legionnaire caps, beanies will be available in the sky blue. The book bags and PE bags will be in the jade. We appreciate the cost of uniform so there is no expectation for any of our children to switch for September, they will be able to wear our current uniform until they have outgrown it. As always, we will encourage our children to wear their uniform, however it is not compulsory.
